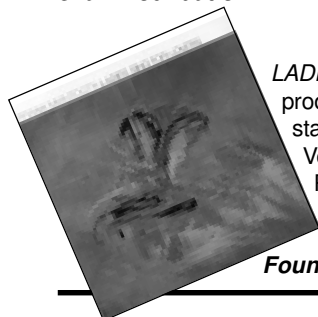

Vocalists include Diane Shuur, Margarete Carlson, Rebecca Parris, Karrin Allyson, Pauls West, Kirsten Gustafson, Jay Clayton, Sunny Wilkinson, Stacy Rowles and others. **The cost is \$15 and all proceeds will go to the Wheelchair Foundation!**

Last year, thanks to the support of our great audience, the *Frank Mantooth Jazz Festival* donated \$5,500 in Frank's name to **HEIFER INTERNATIONAL** which was enough to provide an ARK of animals to individuals in developing countries.



This year we hope to donate at least 50 wheelchairs in Frank's name to people in need through the **WHEELCHAIR FOUNDATION**. Each wheelchair is only \$75 and constructed to last a lifetime. This nonprofit organization leads an international effort to create awareness of the needs and abilities of people with physical disabilities, to promote the joy of giving, to create global friendship, and to deliver a wheelchair to every child, teen and adult in the world who needs one but cannot afford it. For these people, the *Wheelchair Foundation* delivers Hope, Mobility and Freedom.

Tonight during the second intermission members of our *New Trier Jazz Ensemble I* will be in the upper and lower lobbies and walking the aisles with hats in hand to collect donations to the *Wheelchair Foundation*. **Our jazz program will match the first \$2,000 raised. In order to meet our goal of 50 wheelchairs, we only need the audience to donate \$1,875, which is a little more than \$1 per audience member!** Checks can be made out to the *Wheelchair Foundation*. Demonstrating the portion of New Trier's motto that says "Hearts to Compassion and Lives to the Service of Humankind," last year the Jazz Ensemble program donated more than \$10,000 to such organizations as the *American Cancer Society*, *Heifer International* and the school's *Hurricane Katrina Relief Fund*.



TITO PUENTE was born in 1923, and became involved in Latin jazz as a percussionist and eventually a band leader. During his career from 1937 to 2000 he recorded over 100 albums, the most well known of which were *Dance Mania* and *Mucho Puente*. Because of his excellence in arranging and composing, as well as in leading his big band, *Tito Puente and His Orchestra*, Puente was inducted into the Hispanic Hall of Fame, the Jazz Hall of Fame, and also has a star on the Walk of Fame in Hollywood. Throughout his career, Puente was awarded five Grammys and became known as the King of Latin Music. Puente died in New York City on May 31, 2000.

The Tito Puente All-Star Alumni Big Band is made up of members who toured the globe with Puente and his ensemble for the last 30 or more years. The band is known for their exciting, high energy shows and their danceable Latin music that will have any audience tapping along in their seats. The band is now under the musical direction of Jose Madera and features music of Latin greats such as Tito Puente, Machito and Tito Rodriguez. The members of the band come from a variety of musical backgrounds and have played with some of the most well known Latin big bands throughout their careers. For tonight's performance, they will be reunited with the great Latin jazz pianist Eddie Palmieri for their first LIVE worldwide webcast.

EDDIE PALMIERI, known as the Sun of Latin Jazz, was born in Spanish Harlem in 1936 and began playing the piano at an early age. By the time he was 13 years old, he was playing timbales in his uncle's orchestra. Palmieri was a member of this orchestra for two years, but decided that the piano was what he wanted to focus on, not the timbales.



Palmieri was greatly influenced by his Cuban background. He explored the rhythms and timbres of Cuban music and became one of the leading promoters of Latin Jazz. He was also influenced by the music of his older brother, pianist Charlie Palmieri and Lili Martinez, as well as other well known jazz artists such as Art Tatum, Herbie Hancock, and Miles Davis.

Palmieri began his professional career as a pianist in the 1950s, and in 1961 he formed his own band, *Conjunto La Perfecta*. This ensemble was made up of two trombones, flute, percussion, bass and a vocalist. Palmieri led this band and played piano with many others, collaborating with some of the biggest names in Latin Jazz. In 2000, the album *Obra Maestra/Masterpiece*, a collaboration with Tito Puente, was released. This album earned one Grammy award, as well as one Latin Grammy award. Throughout his 50 year musical career, Palmieri has won a total of 8 Grammys. He has also been awarded an honorary doctoral degree from the Berklee College of Music and has had two of his performances recorded for the Smithsonian Institution's catalogue of the National Museum of American History in Washington, D.C.. These honors and awards have helped to make Palmieri one of the most well known Latin Jazz artists and band leaders today.

Beginning in 2005, the festival was renamed **The Frank Mantooth Jazz Festival at New Trier High School** in the honor and memory of a great jazz educator, composer, and friend of New Trier jazz students. Using a non-competitive format, the four primary purposes of the festival are to provide high school and junior high jazz musicians with...

- an opportunity to perform for and be critiqued by some of this country’s most outstanding jazz educators
- an opportunity to attend clinics on performance techniques, music careers, jazz improvisation, and other topics of interest by leading jazz professionals
- an opportunity for student musicians to be individually recognized with certificates and other awards
- an opportunity to attend concerts by some of the world’s greatest jazz artists and big bands
