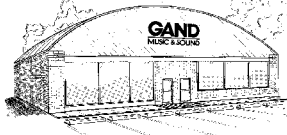

The New Trier jazz ensembles are in the middle of a school-yearlong project called “**Hey NOLA, we didn't forget you!**” with two primary goals that, if reached, will do something significant to help the forgotten student and professional musicians of New Orleans. During our upcoming Spring Break in March, the seniors in our jazz program, the members of *Jazz Ensemble I*, and saxophonist Jeff Coffin

will travel to New Orleans to work with *Habitat for Humanity* to build a house in or near “Musicians' Village”, and perform concerts for the “Village” residents and *Habitat* volunteers from around the country. The “Musicians' Village” website is Nolamusiciansvillage.com.

We have just produced a double, limited-edition CD with 28 selections recorded by some of our guest artists with our *Jazz Ensemble I* over the past 24 years at the *Frank Mantooth Jazz Festival at New Trier High School*. Due to the waiving of performance fees by every guest artist, the waiving of royalties by every living copyright holder of the music, and the willingness of *Mark Custom Recording* to produce the CDs at cost, we are excited that **ALL proceeds from the sale of these CDs go directly to “Musicians' Village.”**

Our jazz program's goal is to raise \$75,000, which is the cost of building a *Habitat* house in “Musicians' Village”. We have already raised \$28,000 by holding a *16-Hour Marathon/Telethon/Web-A-Ton Jazz Concert for NOLA* November 30. The entire concert was broadcast live on two of our local northshore Chicago cable TV channels, simulcast in stereo on our school's FM radio station, and streamed worldwide over the Internet on NTJazz.com. Donations were received from all over the country and as far away as England.

JON FADDIS dedicates his musical experience to making the CJE its very best. He brings his virtually unparalleled skill and passion as a trumpeter and conductor, but also his abiding enthusiasm for jazz education to Chicago and beyond.



Mr. Faddis draws on over thirty years' of experience in performing with and conducting superb jazz big bands. Such big bands include Lionel Hampton's big band, which Mr. Faddis joined at 17, just after graduating from high school in Pleasant Hill, California, and the Thad Jones/Mel Lewis Orchestra (now the Vanguard Jazz Orchestra), with which Mr. Faddis began, at 18, playing lead trumpet and touring for the U.S. State Department. Mr. Faddis has played with the Duke Ellington Orchestra, the Count Basie Orchestra, and the Mingus Big Band, under the direction of their namesakes, and with Gil Evans' ensembles.

Mr. Faddis served as music director for Dizzy Gillespie's Grammy™-award winning United Nation Orchestra and for Dizzy Gillespie's 70th Birthday Big Band. After Dizzy's passing in 1993, Mr. Faddis led the Dizzy Gillespie Alumni All-Stars Big Band, a band which continues to champion the music and mentoring style of Dizzy – Mr. Faddis' close friend and the band's namesake – around the world. Mr. Faddis conducted the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra, and in 2000 in a concert of Duke Ellington's Sacred Music (a performance made available in 2004 through public radio's American Mavericks series). Mr. Faddis has also conducted the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra in New York and on tour, and he has made numerous guest appearances with orchestras worldwide.

Devoted to teaching the next generation of jazz musicians and audiences, Mr. Faddis frequently conducts clinics and master classes for students of all ages around the world. In recognition of his work, Mr. Faddis received the first-ever honorary doctorate in Jazz Studies from the Manhattan School of Music (May 2003) and the Milt Jackson Award for Excellence and Accessibility in Jazz (2001); Mr. Faddis is also artist-in-residence and Director of Jazz Performance at the Conservatory of Music, Purchase College, SUNY. His vision of the Chicago Jazz Ensemble encompasses making educational outreach and opportunities for more students an even greater priority, and – as Guest Lecturer at Columbia College Chicago – Jon Faddis leads master classes and workshops designed to achieve that goal.

Celebrated by critics and audiences alike as one of the nation's foremost jazz bands, the **CHICAGO JAZZ ENSEMBLE** comprises an elite group of Chicago jazz musicians, ranging from established stars with national reputations and acclaimed Columbia College Chicago faculty, to the city's brightest young talents.
